Boca West Children's Foundation Pickleball Camp

The foundation hosted 60 children over two weeks in June at Boca West Country Club for its annual pickleball camp, offered completely free of charge. Each week welcomed 30 participants from the Fuller Center, who each received comprehensive pickleball instruction, daily lunch, and a complete gear package including new shoes, shirts, drawstring bags, water bottles, and hats.

Nat King Cole Generation Hope's Summer Strings Music Camp

More than 100 elementary, middle, and high school students participated in this two-week music program that concluded with a free community concert. The camp specifically serves children in Palm Beach County with the greatest need and fewest resources, providing professional string instrument instruction and performance opportunities.

Florida Atlantic University Summer Music Camp

Over 200 children learned to play musical instruments under professional instruction, culminating in a public concert at Florida Atlantic University (FAU). The program introduced young musicians to instrumental performance art while building skills and confidence.
